



ACADEMIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY-GLOBAL CAMPUS AND HONORS TRANSFER COUNCIL OF CALIFORNIA

Purpose

The purpose of this program is to establish collaboration between Colorado State University–Global Campus (CSU-Global) and the Honors Transfer Council of California (HTCC) to enable motivated students at HTCC member colleges to make a smooth transition from the community college to Colorado State University–Global Campus for completion of their bachelor's degrees.

Goals

- 1. Enhance curricular continuity and support between CSU-Global and HTCC.
- 2. Encourage exceptional students to transfer from HTCC colleges to CSU-Global.
- 3. Assist in baccalaureate degree completion at CSU-Global by HTCC transfer students, especially those who would most benefit from online instruction because of military, career, family, or other obligations.

Commitments

Colorado State University-Global Campus agrees to

- 1. Grant admission to students who have completed the following at a participating HTCC member college with a minimum GPA of 3.0:
 - o all honors program requirements and
 - o an associate's degree in any discipline, including vocational disciplines.
- 2. Accept IGETC certification as completion of lower-division general education requirements at CSU-Global.
- 3. Grant students accepted under this agreement a 10% Tuition Discount Scholarship.
- 4. Make the following guarantees with respect to tuition:
 - maintain tuition at the rate in effect at the start of attendance, for all students.
 - maintain tuition at the rate in effect one year prior to the start of attendance, for students who, after 30 credits at the community college, sign the non-binding CSU-Global Letter of Intent to Transfer.

5. Designate a transfer specialist to assist with communication among CSU-Global, HTCC member colleges, and HTCC member college applicants.

Each Participating HTCC Community College agrees to

- 1. Meet the criteria for participation in the HTCC by providing a rigorous honors program involving general education core courses that require intensive writing and critical thinking, quantitative analysis and challenging laboratory work.
- 2. Provide students in its own honors program with information about CSU-Global requirements, so that those students can consider the advantages of selecting classes with the objective of transfer to CSU-Global.
- 3. Designate the program director, coordinator, or counselor as the primary contact for liaison with CSU-Global.

The Honors Transfer Council of California agrees to

- 1. Require the Chair of Transfer Relations to be continually available in order to facilitate communication among CSU-Global, the HTCC, and HTCC member colleges.
- 2. Require the Chair of Transfer Relations to annually review the lines of communication and accuracy of the contact information of all parties to this agreement.
- 3. Require the Chair of Transfer Relations to provide CSU-Global with contact information for HTCC honors program directors and honors counselors.
- 4. Require the Chair of Transfer Relations to provide CSU-Global with contact information for Transfer Center directors and, when available in a timely fashion, transfer fair dates at HTCC community colleges.
- 5. Invite CSU-Global to the HTCC Counselor Fair.
- 6. Maintain a web portal linking the HTCC website to CSU-Global with appropriate links for assistance to students and counselors.
